I hope you had a lovely bank holiday weekend and were able to enjoy the sunshine before the dramatic downpour on Monday evening!








Despite being a four day week, I have seen lots of lovely learning in school and particularly some great **maths problem-solving**. We are encouraging children to explain their mathematical reasoning when answering questions, so please do that too when possible! (\leftarrow Y2, Y4 and Y3)

We have also been practising singing, 'One More Step Along the World I Go' together and it sounds good. We have been invited to sing at the **Thanksgiving Service** for the Lord Mayor of Leeds, Al Garthwaite, who has been in post this year. The service is from 5:30pm until 6:30pm but will be followed by a buffet and tombola which families are very welcome to stay for. We are not asking children to wear school uniform, but they may 'dress up' as it is a special, civic occasion. Children will sit with their families and then come out to the front when it is our turn to sing. (The words will be printed in the order of service so others can join in with us.) I know it may be a bit tricky with the road closures due to the half marathon (<u>list</u>

here) but it would be good to have a great choir turn out for this special event.

At the **governors'** teaching, learning and pupil support committee this week, reading was discussed. Parent governors were keen to know how parents are informed about how to help their children when **learning to read**. I thought it might be useful to remind all parents about the Reading Records we have in YR, Y1, Y2 and for some children at the start of Y3. As well as providing space to record children's reading at home, it has helpful information about the phonic sounds, key words to learn and tips for reading with your child/ren. As our homework leaflet says, reading is part of the regular essential homework that supports children's learning. A daily reading habit is best and this includes



being read to or reading together, as well as listening to children read. Recording daily reading can be onerous, but making sure children read their home reader at least three times a week and writing that in the record is very helpful. We are trying to build **fluency** in children's reading, so their home reader may not represent the most challenging text they can read. That is why we also have the library books that children can choose to read for information or pleasure and we are always happy for you to write about books they have read at home as well.









Thank you to everyone who has downloaded the new School Comms app. We have conducted a best value exercise and are swapping over to save money and to more easily provide messages to all contacts rather than just the first named contact which we hope will help families to share the parenting admin load more fairly! If you have continued difficulties downloading the app, please come to see us in the office to see if we can help and to make sure we can still stay in touch.
