making sure that children understand the types of bullying (emotional, verbal, physical, cyber) and <u>what bullying is</u> (hurting someone again and again, on purpose to make someone feel bad) and <u>what bullying *isn't*</u>. This way the children know that if it is bullying it is serious and they absolutely have to <u>tell.</u> We remind each other of all the ways we can tell (e.g. the worry box, telling a school adult, peer mediators, our parents and carers) and we receive a gift to help us remember to tell. This year it was a highlighter to highlight bullying. These were given out in a special assembly on Tuesday where children completed activities suggested by School Council to use their new presents. This week we have also had two days of drama where Reception to Year 4 worked on the theme of **Respect** and Years 5 and 6 worked in a mature way on themes of body image in sessions called **Mirror Mirror**. Jane Hinchliffe has useful ideas for parents wanting to talk to their children about bullying – do ask her.
