We are so lucky at Shire Oak to be a city school with good sized grounds and we are pleased our school community use them so well. Even with all that space, however, there are times when we need to organise who has priority where. On Tuesday nights we are very, very full in Acorn Club so it is really important to be able to **use the playground** outdoor space as soon as possible at the end of the school day. We are happy for your supervised children to stay and play, but

please take them round to the <u>front</u> of school so the Acorn Club staff can be clear who they are looking after! If rugby training is happening, the area near the fire pit is still available for adults to chat and children to play. Please don't be offended if Acorn Staff or texts give you a reminder about this from time to time! Whilst on the subject of sharing the grounds, please remember that it is usually only **guide dogs** allowed in our grounds. I know that some families bring the dog for a walk when collecting and dropping off the children, but please make sure that the dogs are left in a way that does not cause them – or any of our children – distress. We do have some children with a genuine fear of dogs so do not leave them anywhere that other people would have to pass them (e.g. right by the gates.) I know there can be security worries about leaving dogs away from the school grounds so there are two places where we make an exception and allow dogs to be tied up as they do not need to be passed by anyone on foot:


- Tied to the fence at the top of the field, halfway between the two pedestrian gates
