

Dear Parents and Carers

**Thank you so much** that so many of you were able to come and join us to celebrate our **school's 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary** (**birthday**) **party**. Thank you also for the wonderfully generous donations of gorgeous food and loans of picnic blankets. Particular and grateful thanks are due to all the parents and staff who worked so hard to decorate the site, organise the food, make the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary display in the hall, take the photos, bake all the birthday cakes, fix the flagpole, sew us a new flag, put up the gazebos, move the furniture and clear up afterwards! (We still have blankets and tins to return.)

At the party School Councillors and Greg Mulholland MP opened our **presents to ourselves**. These are murals of our 6 key values which last year's classes from Year 1 to Year 6 worked on with Ms Virgin, who teaches art in KS2.

Year 1's value is **kindness.** They used the theme of the caring tree they had in Y1 and added images of kindness like creatures looking after their young, people helping someone who has fallen off their scooter, etc. Year 2s value is **love**. They chose to make a mosaic heart, with other smaller pictures hidden in the tilework.

Year 3s value is **trust**. They made little models of people in trusting situations like a blind person and their dog, friends sharing personal things, children trusting their adults and the Shire Oak colours to show it is a place they can trust.

Year 4s value is **respect**. The hands represent all the differences in people and that we respect these, "You, me, all of us!" They particularly identified different religions in this. The prayer bracelet reminds us to respect.

Year 5s value is **forgiveness**. The children thought of different symbols of forgiveness and decided that swans were a strong image of peace. One is holding an olive branch in its beak.

Year 6's value is **compassion** and last year's Y6 articulated strong compassionate messages when they were talking about their plans for this work and so in the end they made a big speech bubble reminding us that whilst we can't take the pain away, we can show compassion in different situations with things we can do and say.



Year 5 are well underway with their special **Wordsworth poetry work**. Anna Fleming, who works with the University of Leeds and with the Wordsworth Trust, is coming in regularly to explore the poems of Wordsworth in reading groups with Year 5 children. The project will culminate in an exhibition in Leeds University that showcases the response of the children and older people from Caring Together to Wordsworth's poetry.

Year 3 enjoyed their trip yesterday to **Thackray Medical Museum** to support their topic 'Humans and Other Animals'.
