

## **Dear Parents and Carers**

As I write this we are coming to the end of another jam-packed week in school. This week is **British Science Week** and we have been making sure there are plenty of STEM activities going on in school to enhance our children's learning. We were



pleased to welcome Dr Becky from Hands On Science to school. She led an assembly to kick the week off and then workshops in every class. Reception: Finger Prints Year One: Kitten Rescue Year Three: Massive Magnets Year Four: Firework Science Year Five: Elastic Racers and Year Six: Circulation and the Heart Year 5 also had an additional STEM workshop from Leeds City College 'Knowledge College' that included rocket building!

As well as external visitors working with our children, we are so fortunate that our **parent community** really steps up to help our pupils too. We were delighted with the

number of parents and carers who were willing and able to come and speak to our classes about how they use science and related subjects in their work. There was a fantastic range and the children were very interested in the diverse topics being shared. Thank you to everyone who volunteered (or had their arm twisted!) to come in.



Children were also able to show off their skills and expertise in science at the **Shire Oak Science Fair** this morning. It was great to see just how well they could share their knowledge and excitement for science with the other children who came to visit the fair. Do ask your child what their favourite activity was. (They may mention bottle music, balloons, static slime, colour changing Skittles, magnetic coins or something else!) I have also seen children roaming the school with Micro:bits to measure and monitor the environment around school. Such a great week!

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the **book drive** and to anyone who has volunteered to help transport our donated books. Year 6 have been boxing them up and couldn't believe just how many books in great condition that were collected.

This week Mrs Sara Mitchell took pupils from Year 5 and Year 6 to Woodhouse Grove for a **Girls' Football Festival**. Our team joined in well, practised their skills and represented the school admirably. We have recently enjoyed a significant sporting success as **Levi** has qualified for the national cross country finals! We are very proud of him as he has tried hard in all weathers to do his best.

This weekend is the annual **Shire Oak Sunday** service at St Michael's Church. They are our Foundation Church and eery year they like to celebrate, support and give thanks for our school in an all-age family service at church. All are welcome and children can join in with as much as they feel comfortable. I have heard a rumour that there will be a hunt for 'lost sheep' with prizes for those who take part as part of the service, as well as the first public outing for our new school song! The service starts at 10am and children are welcome to sit with families or join school staff. Children do not need to wear uniform.



Happily, I know many of you are trying to delay your children getting a phone, particularly a smartphone. For those families that have given their children phones in advance of secondary school, it is useful to remember that you don't have to permit children to use all the features available. Most social media apps have a minimum age of 13, or even 16. As many families use **WhatsApp** as a cheaper alternative to text messaging, it can be missed when deciding what to permit a child to access.

Where we can sometimes notice issues occurring is in the use of Group Chats. These can be friendly in intention, but the sheer number of texts, perhaps at times your child is not allowed to access their phone can be overwhelming for children and the potential for misunderstandings in large groups texts is considerable.
