

**Dear Parents and Carers** 

Another busy week and some very tired children in the run up to the holidays in a week's time. Some of our older children have been worried by the **news from London** this week. The NSPCC, BBC, First News and Winston's Wish have all issued helpful guidance online on how to talk to your children about incidents like this that they have heard about. One thing that makes children feel more secure is to point out the good jobs done by everyone who has been working hard to help keep people safe – like the police, doctors, nurses, etc. Knowing that there are many more of these people in the world is very reassuring to children (and adults!) It was particularly pleasing, therefore, to see Year 1 and Year 2 this morning dressed up as **heroes**... not just superheroes but people they admire from history and stories as well as everyday heroes like vets, firefighters, paramedics, etc.

There has been a lot of dressing up this week and visitors to school this morning could be excused for thinking our uniform is **red** instead of purple! (Although the red hair colouring is definitely not for everyday wear!) School Council have worked very hard to organise a special **Red Nose Day** in school with the guess the baby and child photos, selling out of three boxes of red noses, badges and nail wraps, making a basket of jokes for Drop Everything and (Read a) Joke, class activities with bun cases as well as a whole school comedy show with hilarious antics from Reception to Year 5. School Councillors in Y4 and Y5 also worked hard to put together and lead an assembly this morning that explained why we were raising money — with lots of laughs along the way. The full total needs to be counted up, but at the end of the day yesterday they were less than £8 away from their target of paying to send a child to school for a whole year. Well done to all involved! A fuller report will follow in the new school newspaper that some of our children are writing and editing at the moment.

Thank you to the parents, friends, family and children who supported the **car boot sale** on Saturday. (More accurately a table top sale as it ended up all being indoors!) Thank you to FOSOPS for organising this event and for their work organising a car wash after the Easter holidays. As you know we have always tried to make sure that PTA fundraising is used for 'extras' but you will have seen in the news the tightening of school budgets so this extra funding is becoming more and more useful for us as we try to maintain spending on staff and resources for children's learning. It is also good when our fundraising events give children the chance to show their organisational skills and use real life maths skills and this week it was the turn of **Year 3** to run a **bun sale**. Thank you to everyone who baked or bought buns!

Yesterday **Year 5** spent the day at Headingley Stadium on the popular '**Cricket in the Classroom**' day where they learned and practised lots of good skills, including a chance to get some great cricket coaching. They were complimented on their behaviour and attitude which is always pleasing to hear.

The reason Year 6 are not as involved in Red Nose activities this morning as you might expect is that they received an invitation to a special **Maths Puzzle morning at Lawnswood**. This seemed like a good opportunity to reassure them that high school students (and staff) can also be kind and helpful, that they will enjoy the learning there and perhaps even meet some children from the other local primary schools who were invited and will be in Year 7 with them this autumn at Lawnswood or elsewhere. I am looking forward to our trip there this morning (which is also why there was an early publication deadline for this newsletter and no photos this week!)

We were visited on Tuesday by our diocesan adviser, Ian Thomson-Smith. He was taken on a tour by school councillors from Year 6 and wrote afterwards, "Thank you for welcoming to your school again yesterday, and **please pass on my thanks to Coco and Theo** who did such a brilliant job.
