

Dear Parents and Carers

It was lovely to see so many of you this week at this term's **Parent and Carers Consultation** evening. It is always good to hear from home how things are going and how we can work together to make you child feel safe, secure and ready to learn. Sorry that there were some delays – this is always hard to manage as teachers want to make sure they give time to listen and not make people feel rushed (despite being aware of the queue at the door.) If for whatever reason you have not been able to schedule an appointment this week, then please speak to your child's teacher(s) or the office to arrange a mutually convenient time. Please remember that for **Year 5 and Year 6 we asked the children** to attend this time so that they can give their views, understand what they are working on and come up with plans together. These seemed to go very well but it is a new approach for us so I would welcome any feedback!

Thank you to Year 4 for an informative and interactive assembly yesterday. They certainly seem to be enjoying their science topic and lot learning a across the whole curriculum. Thank you also to the family and friends who were able to join us to share in their achievements.

It is rather timely that after bonfire night we are going to spend a week in school learning about the **environment**, and in particular **air quality** in our **Green Week**. During the week we have lots of great activities planned, including a day of road safety training. (This will include Scooter Safety for some year groups and the chance for our oldest children to use a speed camera in the local area.) As part of this project we are having a **NO CAR ZONE DAY** on Tuesday 8th November. We are asking families not to park on Alma Road or Wood Lane at all and if they have to come by car that they park and stride. We are working with the local community to try and identify any reasonable parking spots that can be used in the area just beyond school and will let you know of any offers. As a longer term strategy we are interested in finding out if parents would like us to help facilitate a **walking bus**. Walking buses are run by parent volunteers on a rota (with support from school) and help families commit to walking most of the way to school as we know that builds good habits, helps children to stay fit and active and is a great start to the day for them. Please let me know by email, text, twitter or in person if you are interested in us exploring this further.

I cannot quite believe how quickly this half term has gone and that we are already breaking up for the half term holiday. For parents not familiar with the pattern of the school year in Leeds/UK, we follow the local authority calendar:

- 3 terms (Autumn Term, Spring Term and Summer Term) which have holidays in between them (typically 2 weeks at Christmas, 2 weeks near Easter and 5-6 weeks in the summer.
- Each term is then split in two, with a week's break. (These are called half terms.)
- Finally, the government say that school should shut for a further 5 days (normally called Training Days or INSET Days... sometimes called Baker Days after the Minister for Education who introduced them!) These days can be spread through the year and we use them for training and working together on continuing professional development. We try to spread them evenly across the days of the week, if we can, so that they don't disproportionately hit part-time working parents.
