

So long as families are following current guidelines we are not stopping children playing outside after school, but please be aware that parents are responsible for their children at that time and contact tracing would still apply in the same way as it would if families were meeting outside school. Unfortunately, however, we cannot currently allow parents and siblings to come in and use the toilets due to the cleaning regime in place.

As children become faster and more practised at the handwashing routines at the start of the day the opportunities for **informal conversations** with class staff will increase.
