- Make choices and decisions


Essential Weekly Homework

These two homework tasks should be done every day or as often as you possibly can:

I. Reading

Children in KSI and some children in KS2 have a school reading book. They start by reading to their grown-ups who will write a comment in the reading journal. As children get more confident it may be that instead they discuss the book with an adult who can ask them questions about what they have read. Our Reading Comprehension bookmark can help with thinking of questions.

Children will also bring home a school library book that they have chosen to read for information or pleasure.



Children can read their own books from home or the local library. To choose a book that is the right level of difficulty when children are still learning to read, ask them to put down one finger for each word they can't work out on a page. O fingers is too easy. 5 is too hard. 3 is probably just about right.

2. Practising key number facts

Learning key number facts off by heart will help children to be more confident and fluent mathematicians. These could be learnt by memorising, and they could also be practised in fun ways e.g. by playing games. You can also find lots of activities to practise these facts on websites including https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/dailyIO

Key number facts for Year 2 Counting in steps of 2s, 5s and 10s Doubles of numbers to 10 Halves of doubles to 10 Addition facts to 10 and 20

Optional Half Termly Homework

If your child needs more ideas for things to do at home try these:

- 1. Maths activity Design a poster or resource using transport that will help somebody learn the ten times table.
- 2. Writing activity Write a diary of a day when you travelled somewhere e.g. to go swimming, to visit family, to go to the seaside etc.
- 3. Research activity Find out about your favourite way of moving around.
